Final Comments & Questions

There is a considerable potential in the thesis for a topical research, which, however, is not quite accomplished. While some sections seem to go off the main focus (e.g. the discussion of Scottish English is more of a linguistic nature, the fact that the first man (meaning obviously the first British person) to die in Australia was a Scot is also interesting but of little relevance to the topic. In the historical part, on the other hand, e.g. The Union of Crowns could have been mentioned as a first step to the Act of Union. Some literary and cultural manifestations of nationalism in Scotland (e.g. the Scottish Renaissance and the figure of Hugh MacDiarmid) would also be a welcome enrichment of the work. A typo (non-vocalized preposition v) at the Czech title page, which is bound in straight after the hardcover does not improve much the overall impression. As such, I regard the thesis a (potentially very) good rather than an excellent work.
