Final Comments & Questions

The thesis clearly shows Mr. Linda's interest in the topic of his research. For this very reason, the thesis becomes an interesting read about using sequential art – comics in language classes. Mr. Linda examines the educational and language value of comics for language learners. Regarding the actual research, it is important to recognize that the research was carried out with 9<sup>th</sup> grades towards the end of the school year which could have had a major impact on some of the findings Mr. Linda presents in his thesis. It would be interesting to try the same research with other age groups to see whether the reluctance towards the medium is something common among secondary school learners or just an attitude of 9<sup>th</sup> grades a few weeks before their graduation.

Due to this project, Mr. Linda has developed a better expertise and understanding of effective use of sequential art with language learners. It is obvious that the thesis has positively contributed to Mr. Linda's education and growth as a teaching professional.

I suggest that the author is awarded the grade "excellent" for his thesis project.
