Final Comments & Questions

The author is to be congratulated on her hard work and the depth of her knowledge. Rarely have I had the pleasure to direct a more talented or hardworking student. The end result, the diploma could be used as a model for the entire culture program, and I am sure it will be used as such in the near future. We should also recognize that the diploma is ambitious as it seeks to cover three novels instead of just one or two. Typically, one of the major issues with diploma works is that of scope, that is to say, the author does not know how to focus his or her coverage to fill up 30 pages properly. Either there is too much coverage of the material or not enough. Three Ishiguro novels could easily make up the body of a Ph.D. dissertation, and I am still a bit amazed that the author was able to whittle these early novels down to a contextual core that perfectly addresses her theme—stereotypes, without falling into plot summary or some other disservice to the novels. In the defense, I would like to hear the author explain the difference between a literary understanding of stereotypes as compared to a scientific understanding of stereotypes and explain how the two concepts are linked in the works of Ishiguro. This is well explained in the diploma already, but it would be prudent for the student to begin with the connection of literature to cognitive psychology as the basis for our discussion. Then we can move on to particular stereotypes (i.e. Butler, Samurai) Ishiguro makes use of in his novels. From there the opponent will lead the discussion into areas she feels could use improvement or further research.
